




OPERATING INCOME (LOSS):




CHANGE IN NET POSITION:




POV Rail vs. Gate/Barge Volume






NIT Rail vs. Gate/Barge Volume










TRAINING METRICS

FYTD 17 Port of Virginia Training Type




FYTD17 Port of Virginia Training Location




