


CHANGE IN NET POSITION:










POV OSHA LOST WORK DAY RATE








POV RAIL VS GATE/BARGE VOLUME






NIT RAIL VS GATE/BARGE VOLUME






VIG RAIL VS GATE/BARGE VOLUME










NIT GATE TURN TIMES









CYBER ATTACK - JUNE 27, 2017

- On June 27, 2017, National Cybersecurity & Communications Integration Center was notified of Petya ransomware events occurring in multiple countries and affecting multiple sectors across Europe.
- The attack was directed at the Ukraine and spread to Western Europe due to poorly secured and unpatched connections. The virus was NOT targeted at Maersk or any US organizations.
- The Port of Virginia has not been impacted by the ransomware that crippled other terminals and banks.
- The Port of Virginia Cyber Security Committee met on June 28, 2017 and enacted measures to enhance security while allowing for normal business practices




Training by Source FY 2017






