

For the Month Ended November 30, 2019




Operating Revenues



For the Five Months Ended November 30, 2019







- Newport News Marine Terminal Dredging contract awarded to W3 Marine (SWaM) \$3M
- Kickoff Meeting with SBSD as per our MOU was held in Norfolk on October 29th
- SWaM outreach. Worked with 20 vendors since kickoff. Currently 6 in process of certifying/recertifying








POV OSHA LOST WORK DAY RATE






POV RAIL VS GATE/BARGE VOLUME






POV RAIL VOLUME






POV GATE TURN TIMES






TRADITIONAL TURN TIME - DEC 2019












POV ATTRITION


Attrition by FYTD



Attrition by Entity




FY20 Terminations by Type




SNIT OPTIMIZATION UPDATE




