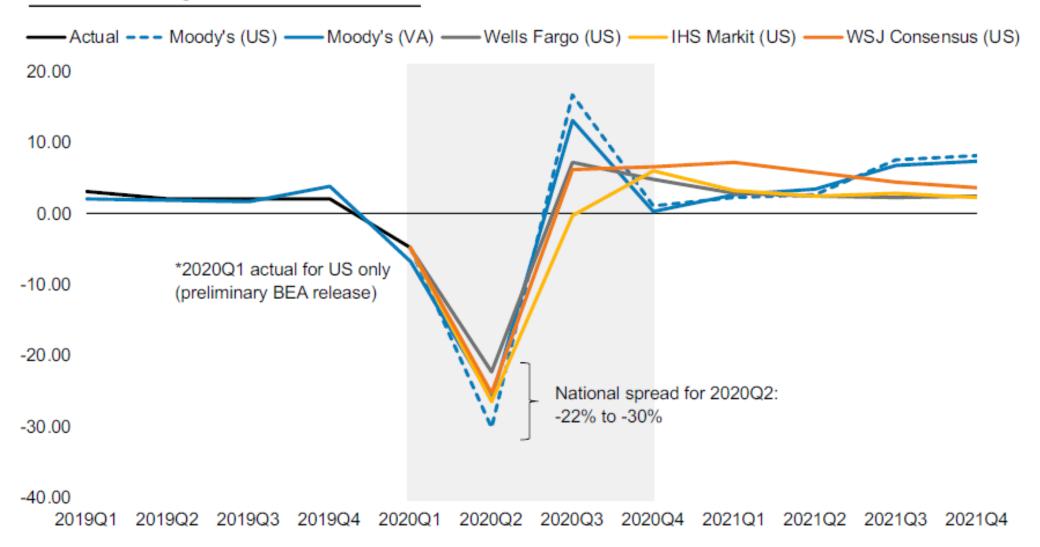

Quarterly real GDP growth

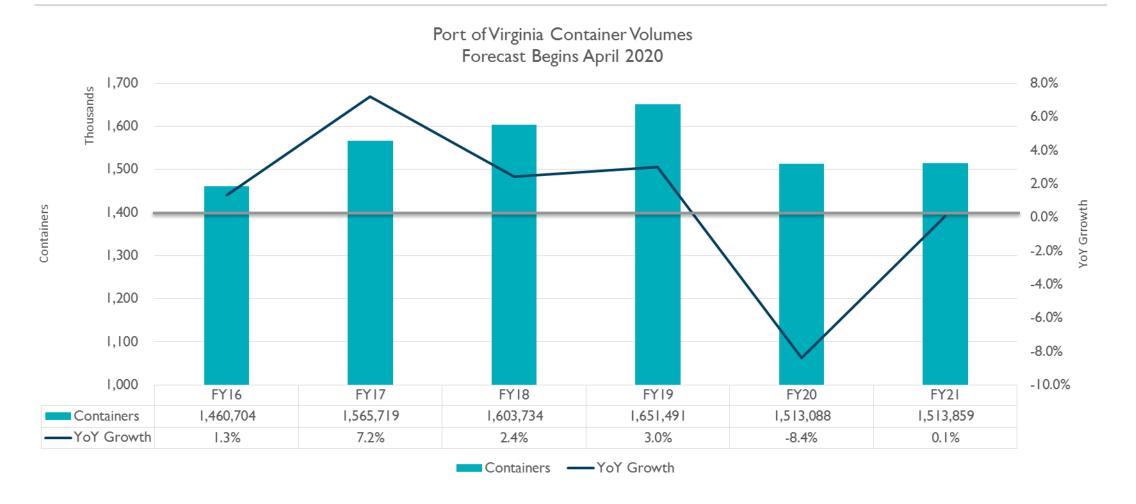
Annualized % change, billions of chained 2012 \$

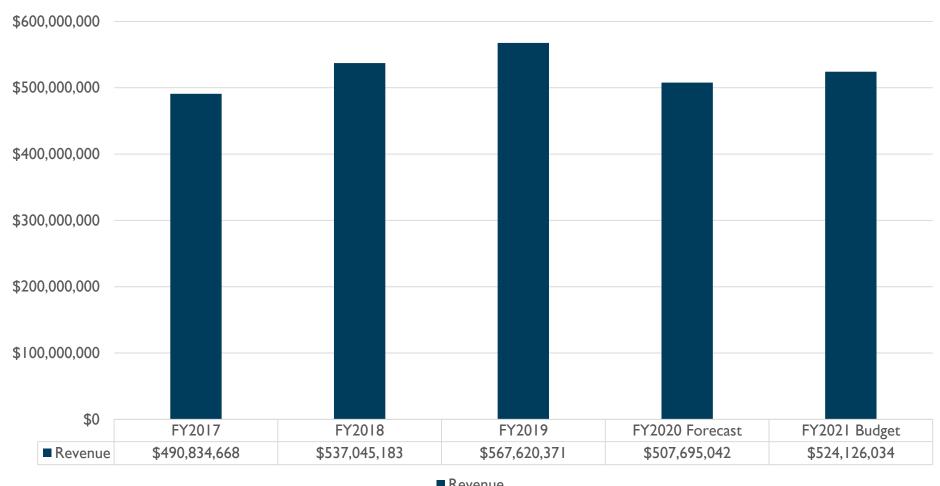

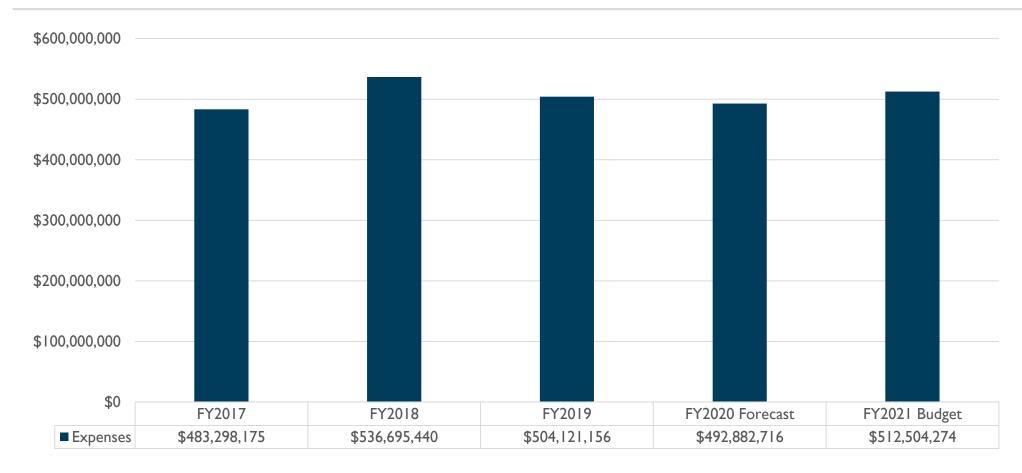
OPERATING REVENUES TREND HIGHER







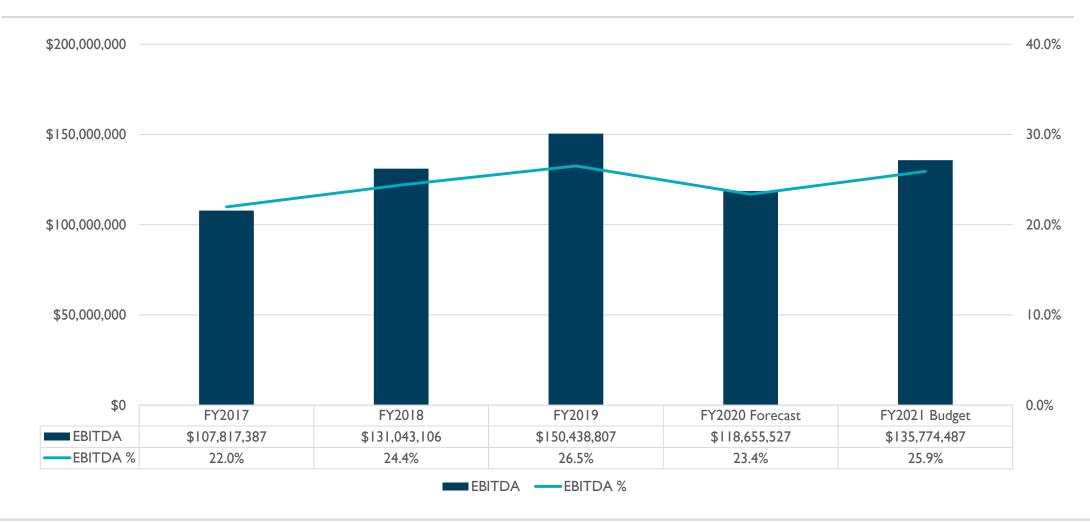

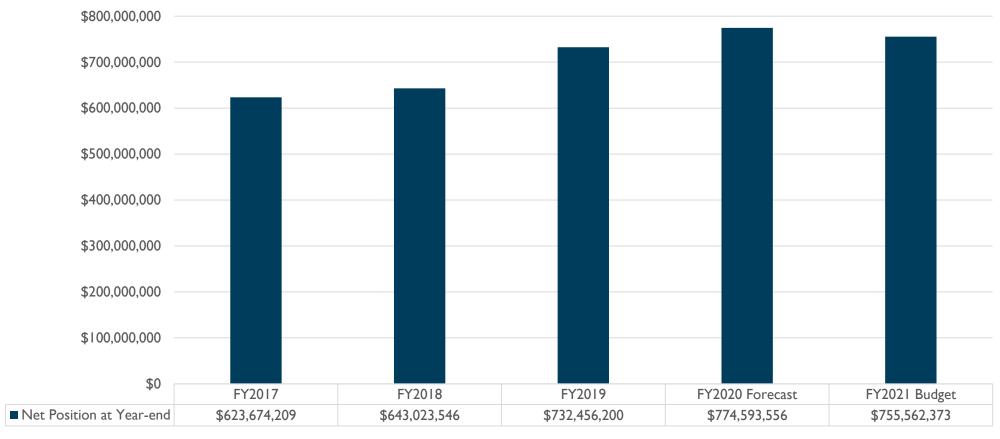


EBITDA MARGIN INCREASES

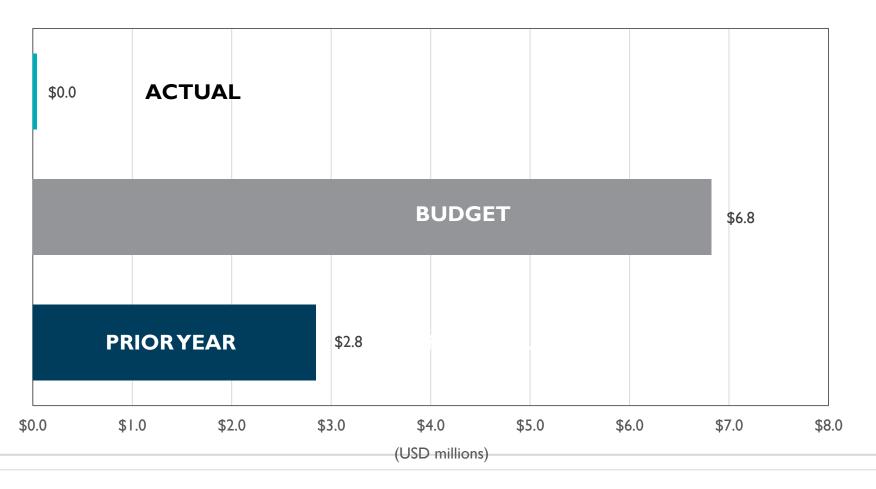

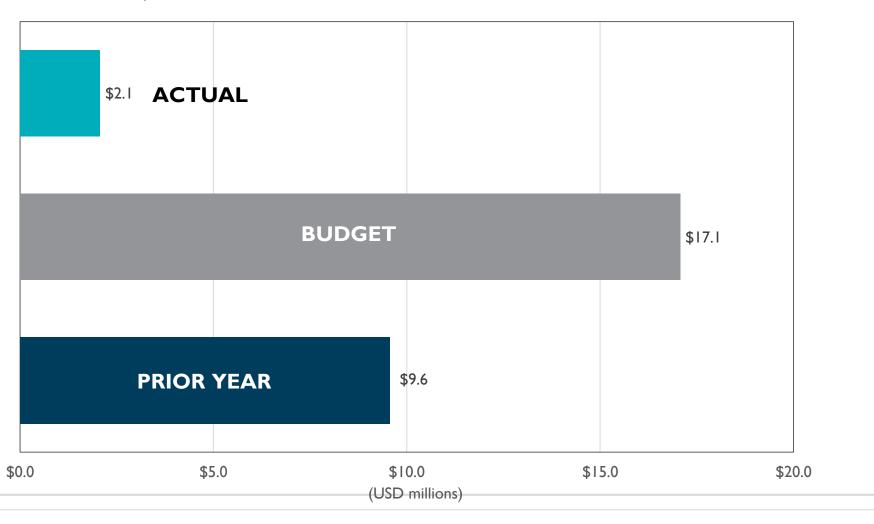

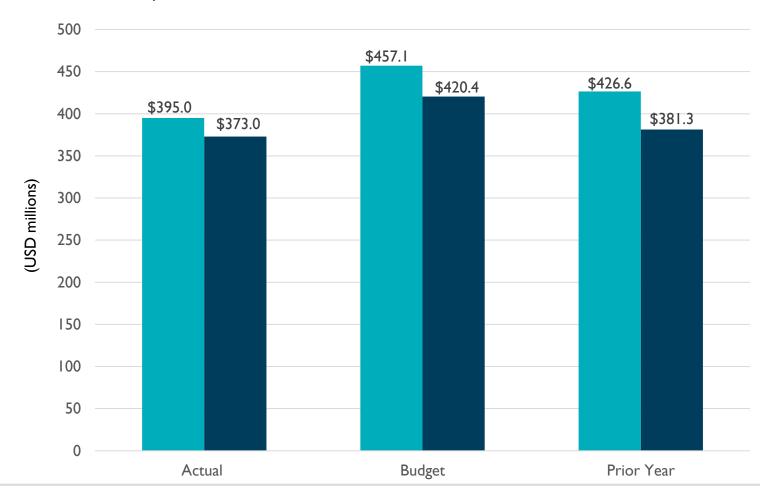

For the Nine Months Ended March 31, 2020

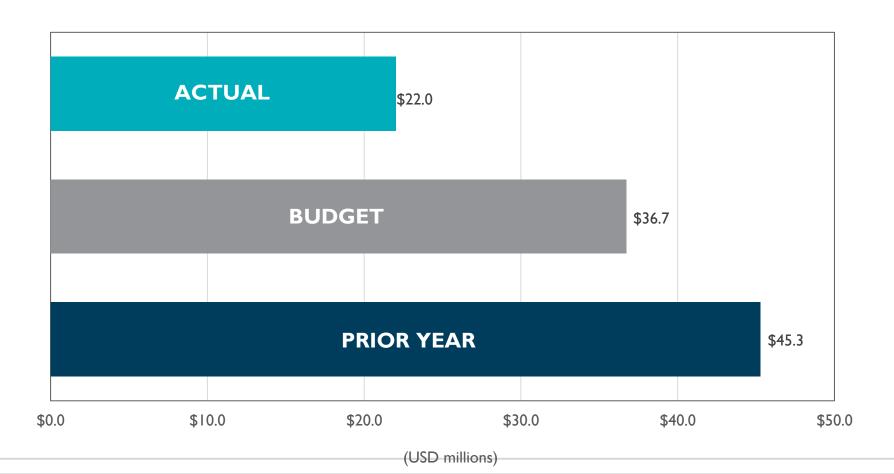

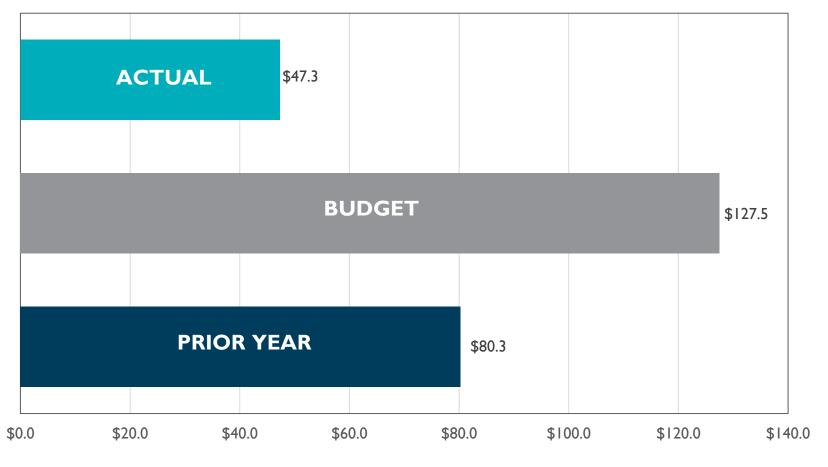

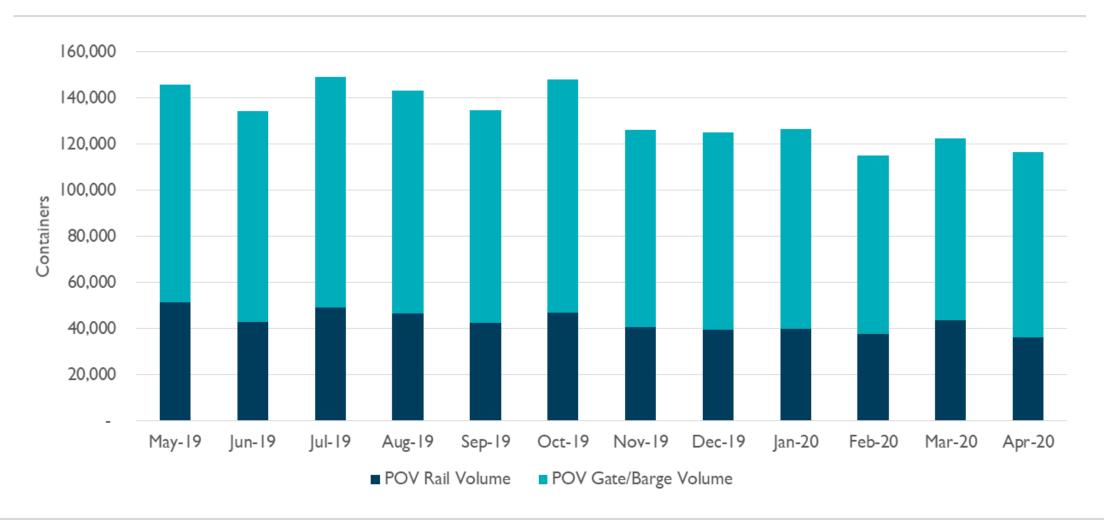


POV OSHA LOST WORK DAY RATE



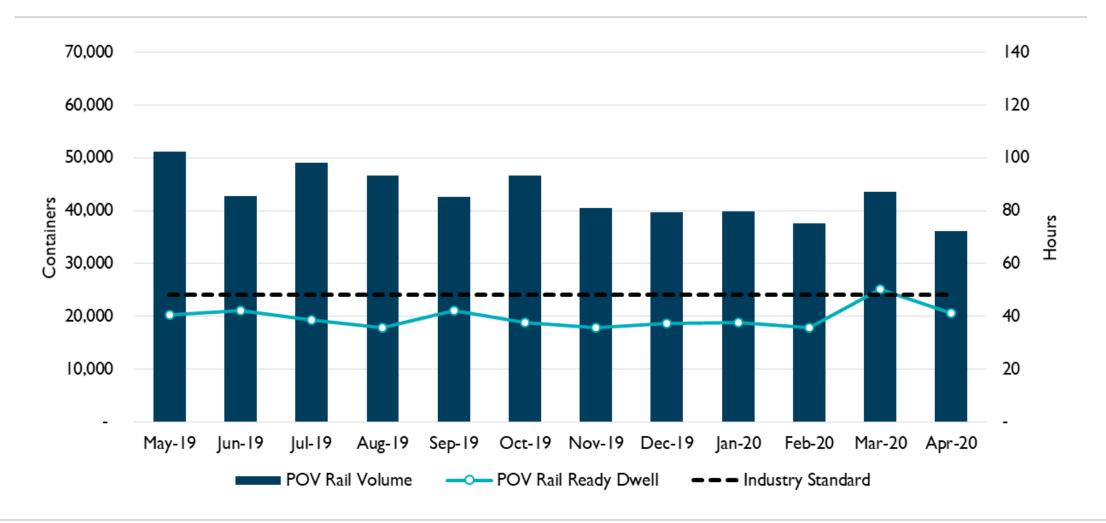


POV RAIL VS GATE/BARGE VOLUME



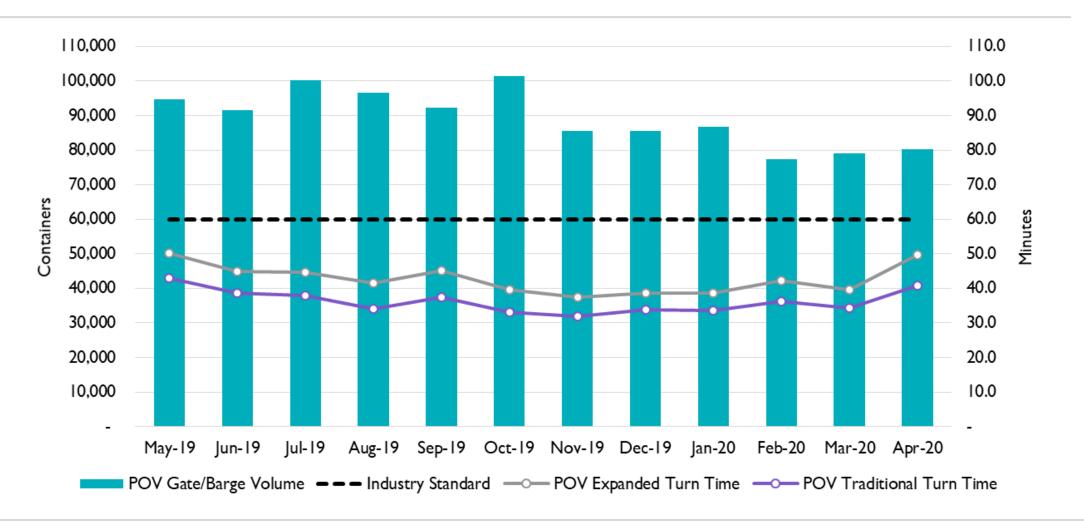


POV RAIL VOLUME



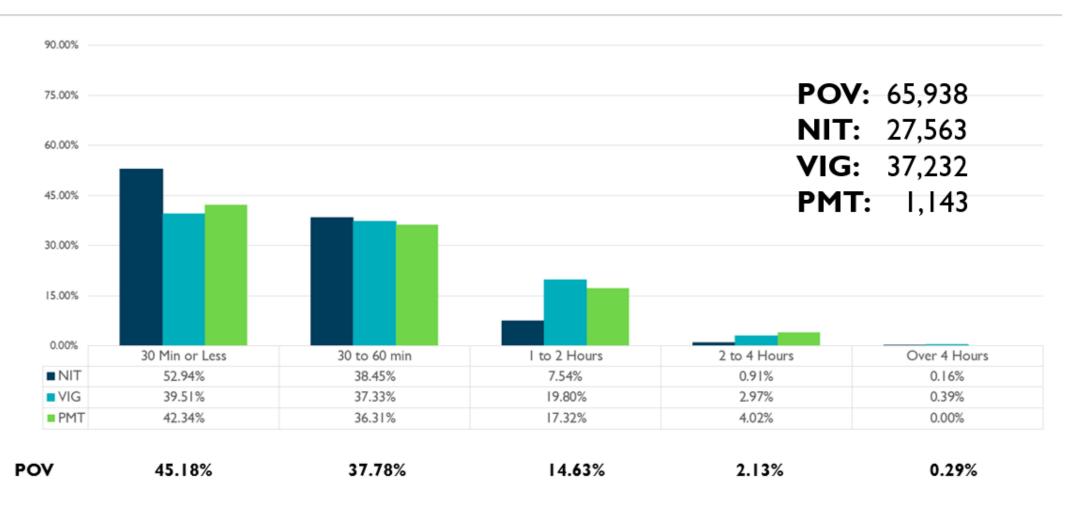


POV GATE TURN TIMES



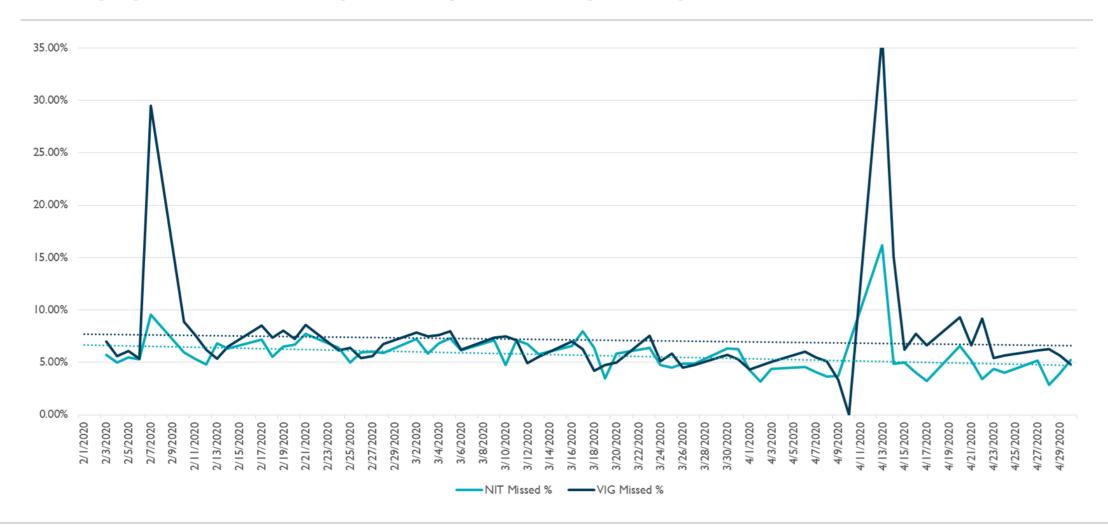


TRADITIONAL TURN TIME - APR 2020

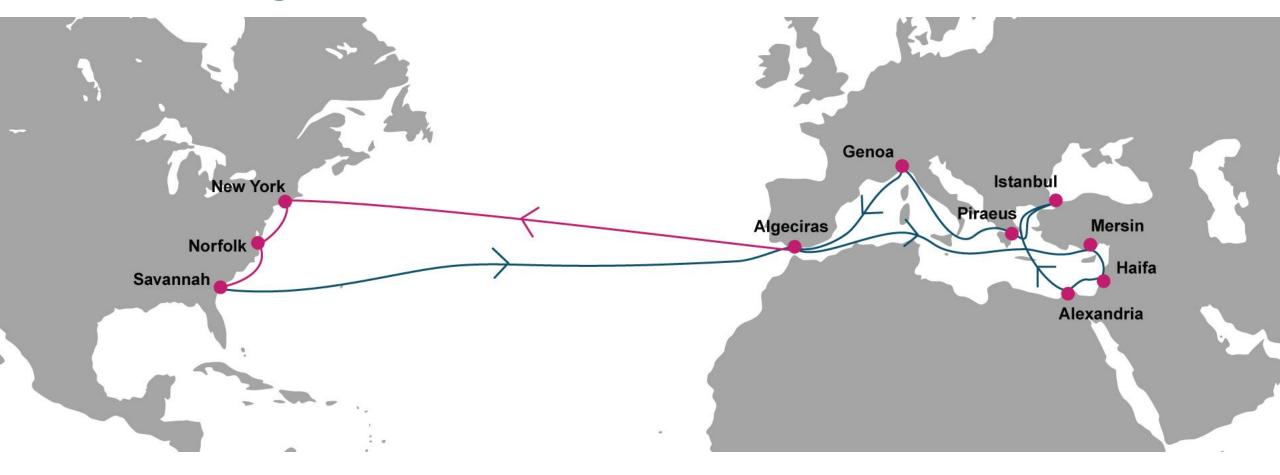

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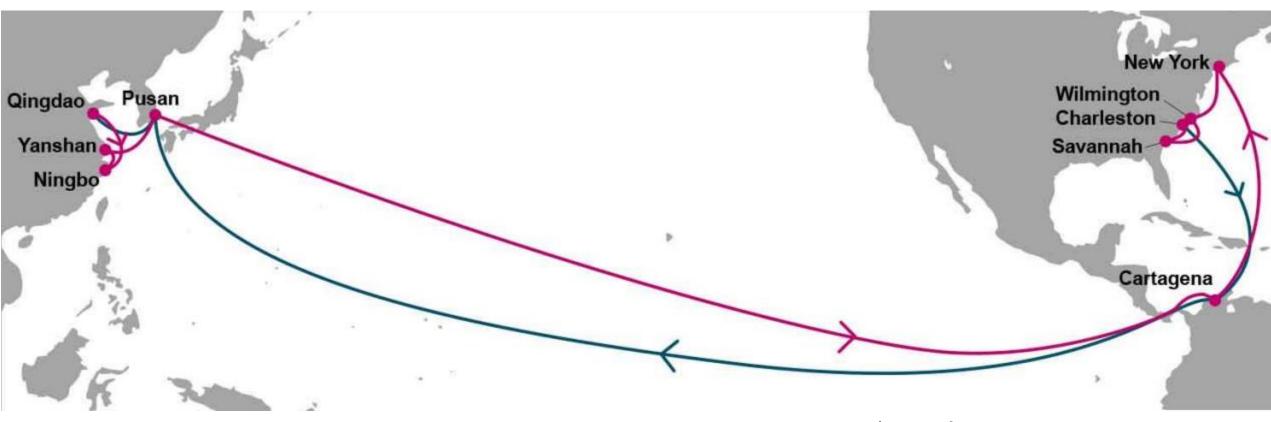

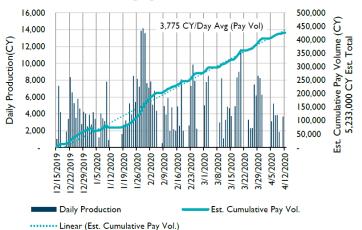

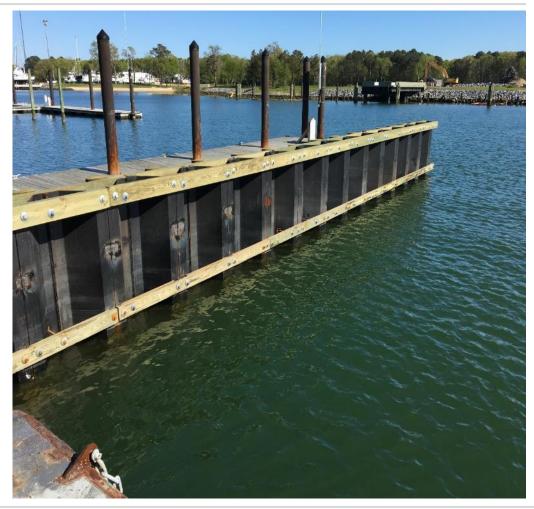
